Conflict and Problem Narratives Workshop

Discover and learn how our stories of problem moments can be held with dignity and where conflict disillusion practices create alternative possibilities for individuals and organisations.

What is it about? In our two days together, we will explore conflict dissolution practices that honour the competing narratives and invite individuals and organisations to collectively undergo transformation in standing against problems.

We will focus on the following themes and questions:

- How to work with conflict and problem narratives in individual and group contexts
- Understanding the role of taken-for-granted beliefs and ideas in conflict and problem narratives
- Placing the problem in relation to individuals and communities
- Standing against problems
- Standing on the shoulders of the alternative moments

Who should attend? Leaders, managers, HR and OD practitioners, coaching professionals, educators, social workers, facilitators of group-work, activists and healthcare professionals.

How will we learn? In this workshop we learn through conversation and the movement between content and life experiences. The learning experience seeks to ignite the beauty and dignity of all who participates.

And there is more: This workshop is one in a series of [six workshops](#) that can be attended as a whole or separately. These workshops address the most important themes of re-authoring ideas and practices over a 7-month period. The workshops are designed to be stand-alone experiences of learning so that participants can enter the journey at any point without feeling excluded.
